Club By-law Amendments Approved

MIS Veterans Club members unanimously approved several amendments to the organization's by-laws, at a special general membership meeting in June.

The meeting was held at the 100th Infantry Battalion Veterans Education Center, made available through Lloyd Kitaoka, center president.

A key change was modifying the categories of membership to maintain the club's status as a tax-exempt war veterans' organization. The new by-laws now identify the club as an "association" rather than a "corporation," a change that will allow more flexibility in State of Hawaii reporting requirements.

The members approved a strategic plan that sets forth goals and programs for the 2014-2019 period.

Search for Lost Blaisdell Memorial

When the Honolulu International Center was dedicated on September 12, 1964, it was dedicated as a memorial to Hawaii's war veterans.

On that day, Governor John A. Burns and Honolulu Mayor Neal S. Blaisdell unveiled a plaque with this inscription: "Honolulu International Center: Dedicated to all the sons and daughters of Hawaii who served their country in time of war and in special tribute to those who gave their lives in order that freedom and justice might prevail throughout the world."

A lot has happened in the half-century since. The HIC is now known as the Neal S. Blaisdell Center. There's a multi-story parking lot, meeting rooms, and a box office.

The landscape has changed. The Caldwell administration recently announced plans for the redevelopment of the NBC grounds.

And the memorial to the war veterans has disappeared. The plaque is gone, forgotten along with memories of the center's designation as a memorial.

Tanya Harrison has embarked on a mission to locate the missing plaque, identify people who remember the occasion, and rededicate the NBC as a war memorial. She has enlisted the support of veterans groups and others to aid in her goals.

Arthur Ishimoto, retired Air Force major general and MIS veteran, delivered the keynote address at the opening ceremony for the Military Intelligence Service Historic Learning Center at the Presidio of San Francisco.

More commonly known as Building 640, the site served as the first training center for Nisei linguists, who began Japanese language studies weeks before the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. The building has been preserved and developed as a learning center by the National Japanese American Historical Society.

General Ishimoto spoke of the many contributions of the MIS during World War II. Repeating a theme he raised in a panel discussion last year, he made a point of noting that the MIS were "not just interpreters." After the war, he went on to serve as commander of the Hawaii National Guard and adjutant general of the Hawaii Department of Defense. He achieved the highest rank of all Japanese American veterans of World War II.
